





Q8. Postcode Response Rates (numbers, average response rate 45%)





How to Read Charts with Average Rating Scales Using previous slide as an example




These charts are designed to compare respondents' strength of feeling on average across several different attributes:

- The scale ranges are plotted and it is easy to see how strongly opinions are held


This chart shows which are "aspects of EB are liked best"






Q20 Types of development desirable within the parish? Prompted list


- There were many comments about retaining EB's special character








Q38. Thinking about their role in the life of the village, how would you rate the following?



Q. 39 Adequacy of <u>INDOOR</u> sports and leisure facilities for different age groups?












Q66. How many vehicles do you as a household have at home?




Q67. Where are your vehicles kept?




Q68. Rough estimate of car journeys household made in the last seven days
























Q108a. HAVE YOUR SAY What sort of village you would like East Bridgford to be in 5-10 years time
